Seasonal Rentals 🖗

Please carefully read descriptions marked with a snowflake to see how they are affected by winter availability. Additionally, around October—November, hunting season is active around the Hoover property. Hunting is not allowed on Hoover—but the properties surrounding it may have people hunting there. We will ask you to fill out a waiver acknowledging this during hunting season, and strongly encourage you to stay out of heavily wooded areas and wear bright clothes when out on property.

Mark Lodge

Capacity: 36 Cost: \$125/night

Mark Lodge is centrally located near both the waterfront and large games field. The main floor features a full kitchen and large multipurpose room with folding tables and chairs, TV with DVD player and single bathroom. In the basement are two large Troop Rooms, each with a bathroom with flush toilets and sinks. While this building does have water and heat

access, there are no showers. There is a pavilion with picnic tables and a charcoal/ wood grill our front near the lake shore.



Fern Lodge

Capacity: 24 Cost: \$100/night

Fern Lodge has the "homeiest" feel of the Troop Houses. Features that troops report to love the most are the house's two large Troop Rooms with mattresses on the floor and cubbies, two small private rooms, flush toilets, showers, fire place, washer, dryer and full kitchen.

Rustic Units

Cabin Units are unheated but are available year-round for groups that want to take advantage of warm spring or fall days. Cabin Units are walled-in with cots to sleep on. All cabin and tent units have access to pavilions, picnic tables, charcoal/wood grill, fire pits and cold-water hand wash stations. They also all use the Shower House near Tall Timber, which is open outside of Winter Availability for bathrooms and showers. Unit boxes with various pots/pans and cooking utensils are available seasonally. Groups will be expected to bring their garbage to the dumpster near Mark



Sherwood Cabins 🕸

Capacity: 32 Cost: \$75/night

Sherwood is close to the center of the property and sits just within the woods near the lakefront. The location of these five cabins gives troops the ability to experience camping in the woods while still being near other activities on the property. No water or heat during



Highland Cabins 🕸

Capacity: 32 Cost: \$75/night

Highland's five cabins are at the heart of the activity field, allowing easy access to the GaGa ball pit, basketball court, volleyball court, flagpole and a large open area to run. No water or heat during Winter Availability.



Tall Timber Tents 🍀

Capacity: 32 Cost: \$55/night

The eight tents of Tall Timber are elevated on wooden platform floors with canvas walls for a true camping experience and are adjacent to the Shower House. Settled further down the wooded trails, Tall Timber has beautiful surroundings to explore and the most nature at arm's length. Not available during Winter Availability.



Activities and Notes



Waterfront

Hoover's waterfront is centralized, easily seen and accessed when you first drive on property. Fishing poles, life jackets and boats are in the Boat House, which will be unlocked during your rental time. Fishing is allowed off of the shoreline to the right or left of the docks, but not in the swim area. A lifeguard is required when swimming or boating, and a small craft certified boating instructor is needed to use the boats. Lifeguards are

required to fill out the waterfront log in the Boat House every time there is swimming.

Waterfront Unavailable: September 21—May 22



Archery

Equipment is kept in the shed labeled "Maintenance" near the range and will be unlocked during your rental time. An archery facilitator is required to use the area and we do ask that you clean up the range when finished. Archery unavailable: November 2—May 1

Equipment Rental

Dutch ovens and pie irons will be brought to your rental location by the ranger prior to your stay. On your reservation, you can indicate how many you would like to use. Skis, snowshoes, sports equipment (including GaGa Ball) are kept in the "Toy Room" side of the Long House near the center field. Cross-country skis, ski boots and snow shoes are available in a range of sizes to accommodate Juniors through Ambassadors.

GaGa Ball

There is one GaGa Ball pit at Hoover for everyone to enjoy, so please be mindful of other campers and remember to share with your fellow Girl Scouts!
